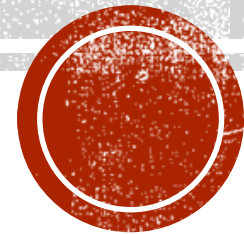

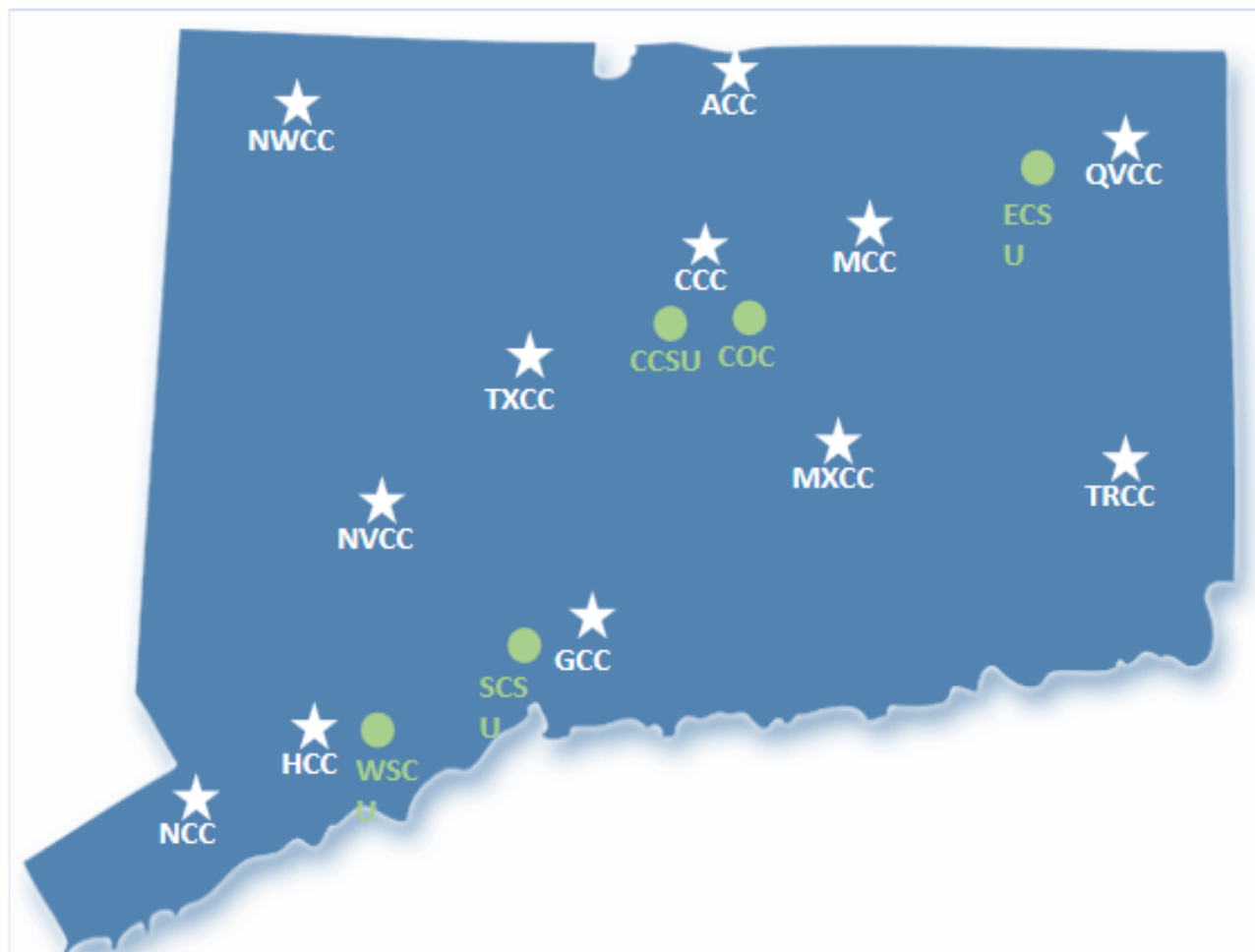

- Fulfill the outcomes of the individual courses with a common team project for students between partners in France and USA to reach subject + international outcomes.
- Consider how you could use this approach to reach more students on your campus with high quality international education and promote broader internationalization goals.



CT COLLABORATIVE LEARNING FOR INTERNATIONAL CAPABILITIES AND KNOWLEDGE (CLICK)



- **Focus: international outcomes starting in the classroom (Click + travel)**
- **CT Community College International Education Initiative**
 - CLICKs-courses – CT CC faculty partner with French faculty using technology to create and implement modules that French and American students complete together
 - Design workshops for participating faculty on how to create and implement modules
 - Travel experience: Explorers program (faculty and students)
- **Funding from French Embassy in US, CT-CC system, CC Foundations**
 - FR Partnerships for Innovation and Collaboration in Study Abroad (PICSA) grants
 - 2017-18 – Asnuntuck, Middlesex CC's Click'ing (Tunxis CC, admin home)
 - 2018-19 – Northwest, Norwalk, Asnuntuck, Middlesex CC's Click'ing (College of Technology, admin home) with new French partners

WHERE WE GO FROM HERE?

- Long term goal, system-wide....
On-ramp to a systematic international strategy.
- Build a curricular anchor to institutionalize the project
 - Certificate w regular “international content” courses including virtual exchange
- Build the resource base
 - Funding NSF, ERASMUS, etc.
 - Recruit teachers, partners
