Welcome Remarks – Dr. Christine Broadbridge, Dean – School of Graduate Studies, Research & Innovation; Education Director, CRISP, an NSF MRSEC, Southern CT State University

 Hubert Godin, Middlesex Community College (MXCC), reported that MXCC is aligning their manufacturing programs with Asnuntuck Community College's manufacturing programs. They expect to have the programs begin in fall 2017. It looks positive that they will have a building for manufacturing.

Computer Science Presentation – Winnie Yu, Interim Director – Office for STEM Innovation and Leadership (STEM-IL), Southern CT State University

- There are over 300 students and 32 graduate students in the Computer Science department. The department has 2 B.S. degree programs (General Computer Science and Computer Information Systems) and 2 M.S. degree programs (Software Development and Cybersecurity). The B.S. programs require a capstone project. The M.S. programs require a thesis or special project.
- For Community and Civic Engagement SCSU has participated in the following: CT Technology Council Skills Challenge; National Pacesetters by NCWIT; Google Ingnites CS outreach; and White House recognition for addressing the call to #CSforAll.
- The number of females in the program has doubled.
- SCSU hosts the GLOBE Conference for environmental science.
